Immediate Needs

Kindergarten Aids and First Grade Teacher

- o AP Coles resent letter to DCPS Superintendent along with LSAT parents' letter of support. Current petition window closes at the end of September but feel hopeful it will be approved.
- o A third 1st grade classroom will open once teacher is approved and starts.
- o Beginning to look now at resumes and talk to potential teachers.
- Outstanding vacancies overall and CES staffing
 - o Waiting for PE teacher, 4th grade ELA, and 2 aids to get clearance to teach.
 - o Two additional teaching aids are needed.
 - o Substitutes are helping to fill gaps.
- ECE Playground Redesign and Modernization
 - o Approved to replace enclosed ECE playground next to school for Prekindergarten and CES students (design images in slides). Playground will be fenced in and offer sensory activities and shaded area with tables that was reviewed by the SPED team.
 - Construction will start as soon as possible and take about 6 weeks (fastest, but planning for up to 10) to complete. While playground is under construction, ECE classes will move to field during recess.
 - o PTO has been separately working on approving a vendor for fencing for an outdoor fence located outside the Pre-kindergarten (3) entrance for an outdoor classroom space.

Review Parent Survey Findings

- 2024 parent survey was fielded at the request of the LSAT and school administration.
 DCPS has a Panorama survey that is disseminated twice a year for both students and parents that asks questions around being loved, challenged and prepared.
- 63 parents responded to the survey and indicated they felt overall satisfied in school activities and engagement with other parents and families. Open comments shared that parents want important and actionable information up front (e.g., signup for clubs), activities offered at different times, more advanced information on the timing of school events, more parent-classroom involvement, 1:1 parent teacher conferences, more grade-level activities, and prefer that information not be shared as PDFs. Mustang Express (email newsletter) was the most preferred option for communication followed by Remind and text message. The Community Weekly sent by Principal Russell weekly is popular. Overall position comments about school administration and PTO.
- School is phasing out Remind and using Class Dojo for parent teacher communications.

Review 2023-2024 End of Year Data

• 76% of students are on or above grade level in ELA and 73% are on or above grade level for Math, which is above average for our school cluster.

- For standardized testing over the past two years (DC CAPE in SY 23-24 and PARCC in SY 22-23), students were 74% proficient in ELA (2% growth) and 65% in Math (8% growth).
- Disparities exist between black students (63% ELA and 46% Math) and white students (84% for ELA and Math) comparing CAPE data in SY23-24.
- 90% of K-2nd grade students are performing at above benchmarks but lower performance for 4th and 5th grade students last year. Similar patterns when reviewing PARCC/CAPE data for black males and white students. Will look at data for black females next.
- School will focus on supporting black students, SPED students, and needs based small groups utilizing the MTSS intervention framework.
- ECE, Math, and ELA coaches meet with DCPS central office and academic leadership team in 4th and 5th grade band has been meeting.
- Beginning of Year (BOY) testing ends the first week of October.
- Current student demographics are approximately 60% black, 35% white and other is mixed races or other races.
