The concert will feature songs and dances from more than 15 countries, including Chile, Cuba, Ghana, South Africa, France, and the U.S. More than 10 languages will be used, including Spanish, French, Zulu, Russian, and German. Ms. Michaud's art students are creating artwork to accompany the music and dance, representing many cultures around the world. This concert of international songs and dances supports Shepherd's dual language program and our effort to become an International Baccalaureate primary school. The songs and dances help our students understand other people, their similarities and differences, and our common goals of peace, freedom, and human dignity. 



DC-BAS

In preparation for the DC-CAS this spring, the second administration of the DC-BAS was conducted last week on January 29th and 30th. The DC-BAS is a district-wide benchmark assessment. This assessment is used to ensure mastery of the curricular standards. The assessment also serves to identify gaps that exist with respect to mastery of the standards. The DC-BAS provides teachers with data to guide instruction prior to the administration of the DC-CAS. All $3^{rd} - 6^{th}$ graders took the DC-BAS.
