Thanks for the Good News! Step up to the Other News!

The PTA Board of Directors and the entire body of PTA parents and teachers sincerely thank those parents who have come forward to make financial contributions and pledges over the past month. Since the January weather-delayed PTA meeting, approximately \$5,700 in contributions (PTA membership fees and Family Enrichment Fees) have been received.

We also thank the parents and teachers who have contributed their valuable time and talent to many PTA activities. These well-deserved thanks are for the good news!

For the other news, we must continue to appeal to parents and friends in the community who need to come forward quickly to make initial contributions or to complete payments or pledges that they have already begun.

That other news is that the activities that the PTA supports at the school still need your support if they are to be continued through the end of this school year. As we were receiving the above-mentioned \$ 5,700 in contributions, we have paid out \$9,400 to meet on-going budgeted expenses. That leaves us still \$2,500 behind our budgeted income for January and February on top of our income shortfall of \$9,000 through the end of December.

This obviously leaves us with a continuing cash flow shortfall that may force reductions in expenditures, which would lead to cutting back on or eliminating the important activities that the PTA supports at the school. We encourage you as members of the Shepherd school family to consider PTA membership and contributing as you are able to the Family Enrichment Fee. These funds support:

- Academic enrichment (test preparation, tutoring, etc.)
- Classroom Instructional aides
- Lunch room monitors
- Information technology support
- Teacher stipends
- Student activities
- Classroom supplies, curriculum materials and supplies for extracurricular activities (i.e. Lego robotics program, science fair, school dances, movie nights etc.)
- Friday morning coffee and food, babysitting and janitorial expenses for PTA meetings
- Teacher Appreciation activities
- Music program instruments and maintenance
- Insurance

With just a few months left in the 2008-2009 school year, we have wonderful classroom instruction taking place, supplemented by the Saturday Academy, and by such great academic and cultural enrichment activities as last week's *Songs of Freedom* concert!

Let's make sure that our children continue to have all of this in March, April May, and June! You can do that by paying a \$50 PTA membership and/or by making a Family Enrichment Fee contribution of \$500 or whatever amount you can - in one payment or several payments over the next 3-4 months.

Shepherd IB-PYP Corner The Importance of Reflection in the PYP

Update:

In our journey toward IB authorization, our goals this month are to produce a relevant and structurally accurate Programme of Inquiry (POI) that we will consider a working draft until next fall, to help students to develop a firm understanding of at least four of the ten Learner Profile attributes and to produce one complete PYP planner on each grade level.

We are continuing to work on our major goals or activities for February, as stated previously in the February 6 *Mustang*. Again, those major activities are:

- 1. Grade level teacher teams continue to collaborate on constructing their units of inquiry.
- 2. The full faculty continues to collaborate on refining the school's POI. (The latest full faculty collaboration was held on Wednesday this week after school during the faculty meeting.)
- 3. Classroom and special subject teachers are introducing the Learner Profile attributes to students on all grade levels.
- 4. Grade level teams are developing a first draft of the complete PYP planner for the unit of inquiry that will be implemented during the last six weeks of school.

PYP Lesson of the Week: Reflection

One of the unique aspects of the PYP is that all students and teachers must reflect on their work regularly. Teachers reflect individually and in collaborative meetings with their colleagues. Students reflect orally and in writing with prompting and guidance from their teachers.

In the classroom, during morning meeting or at the end of the school day, the teacher may invite students to reflect on the day's work by asking them what activity they enjoyed the most, which activity they found easiest, which activity was most challenging, which activity they would like to do again, etc. After an activity, students may be asked to write a reflection using prompts such as,

- most puzzling
- most unforgettable
- most curious
- most surprising
- most moving
- most motivating
- most satisfying
- most boring
- most helpful....and so on

The teacher might also ask the student to say or write *why* he or she feels a certain way or makes a particular judgment. Written reflections are often placed in the student's portfolio.

Questions for reflection and discussion:

Can you find opportunities for your child to do more reflection at home? Try to expand the typical question in the car or around the dinner table, "How was your day?" or "What did you do today?" to include some additional prompts such as the ones listed above.

Literacy Corner

Before and After

Using a newspaper or magazine, have your child find a photograph that interests him/her. Discuss what is going on in the picture. Have your child explain what they think may have happened just before the picture was taken and predict what they believe will happen afterwards. Ask, "Why do you think that?" or "What makes you think that?" Then, for creative writing fun, have your child write a story that includes the events he/she predicted.

*Kids: Use you imagination to come up with the wildest events that you can think of, to include in your story. Attach the picture to your story and share it with a relative or friend.

(My story may include some heroic or even impossible acts to win the race.)







Primary Math Problem

Math Corner



What you'll need A measuring cup, 4 glasses of equal size, and water

What to do

- 1. Pour water at different levels (1/3 cup, 1/2 cup, 3/4 cup and 1 cup) in each glass. Put the glasses next to each other. Ask your child: Are all the water levels the same or different?
- 2. Ask your child questions to encourage comparison, estimation, and thinking about measurement. Which glass has more water? Which has less? How many glasses of water do you estimate it will take to fill the container?
- 3. Pour more water into one of the glasses to make it equal to the amount of water in another glass. Move the glasses around so that the glasses that have the same amount of water are not next to each other. Ask your child: Which glasses do you think have the same amount of water?

As your child begins to understand more, do activities using different-shaped containers that hold the same amount of a substance (water, rice, and popcorn kernels). This helps your child see comparisons, as well as the various capacities of different-sized and -shaped containers.

Parent Tip — Filling empty containers provides opportunities to explore comparisons, measurement, volume, estimation, and geometry.

Intermediate Math Problem



- 1. A gallon of gas costs \$4.29 a gallon. What does it cost for 5 gallons? 10 gallons? 15 gallons? 20 gallons? What is an easy way to figure this out? How can you estimate the cost by rounding the cost per gallon?
- 2. The speed limit is 65 miles per hour. How far will you go in 1 hour? Two hours? Three hours? How long will it take to go 500 miles?



Free Family Film Night at Washington Ethical Society "The Great Debaters," which was directed by and stars Denzel Washington, is the movie in the "Free Family Film Event" sponsored by the Washington Ethical Society, 7750 16th Street NW near Kalmia Road. The movie will be shown at 7 p.m. Friday, February 27.

The movie tells the story of Dr. Melvin B. Tolson. a professor at Wiley College in Marshall, Texas, where, in 1935-36, inspired by the Harlem Renaissance and his clandestine work as a union organizer, Tolson coaches the debate team to a nearly undefeated season that sees the first debate between U.S. students from white and "Negro" colleges and ends with an invitation to face Harvard University's national champions. The team of four, which includes a female student and a very young James Farmer, is tested in a crucible heated by Jim Crow, sexism, a lynch mob, an arrest and near- riot, a love affair, jealousy and a national radio audience.

"The Great Debaters" is rated PG-13 and two suggestive scenes will be edited from the film. The big plus is a question -and-answer session with Shepherd Park neighbors Ken and Joigie Tolson. Ken is the grandson of Melvin Tolson. Light refreshments will be served.
