Greetings! On behalf of Shepherd Elementary School, it is truly my pleasure to extend a warm and heartfelt welcome to you as we start this school year.

Shepherd is a special kind of place. We are a family. Shepherd is a place where the students are generally committed to working hard and doing well in all areas. Students are taught to be inquisitive critical thinkers who take charge of their learning. Their lives are enriched and they are given opportunities to grow and develop socially, physically, mentally and emotionally through a strong, developmentally appropriate curriculum which addresses all core domains on a daily basis. 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'180 Fund' Is Created To Finance PTA and School

In place of PTA membership dues and what had been known as the Family Enrichment Fee, the PTA has established the "180 Fund." There are 180 instructional days in the school year. Parents, can you afford a dollar per day per child to improve Shepherd Elementary? We think you can, and we hope you'll contribute to the 180 Fund.

There are all sorts of things that Shepherd Principal Jamie Miles and PTA leadership have identified since the end of the school year that will enhance the educational program at Shepherd that don't fit into the school or D.C. Public Schools' budget. These include, but are hardly limited to:

- Plastic folders to be provided to each student at the start
 of the school year to facilitate communication between
 the school and the home.
- A redesign of the Shepherd Elementary Web site to make it easier to use – and this year with individual Web pages for each teacher!
- Discovery Education software for the school (available at half price because a Shepherd parent works for Discovery Communications).
- Workshops and seminars conducted by renowned International Baccalaureate educator John Burnell.
- "White boards" to augment and supplement the school's blackboards.
- More laptop computers for teacher use. Currently, we have about one laptop for every three teachers and that just won't do.

With an obvious focus this year on technology and communications, it's apparent that these things won't come cheap. That's why we're reaching out to you now – even before the school year starts – to contribute.

Shepherd Elementary's annual **Fall Fest** will be held Saturday, September 26, at the school. Count on 14th Street being closed to accommodate rides, games, and activities for Shepherd students, their parents and siblings, and neighbors. While Fall Fest raises important money for the school, it's also one of the biggest and best friend-making activities the school has for children and parents alike.

September 26 also marks the kickoff of the school's annual **Scholastic Fall Book Fair**, which runs for two weekends sandwiched around a school week. Last year, Fall Fest and Book Fair planners did a mash-up with the dates, and both the Fall Fest and the Book Fair reported best-ever funds raised.

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Hola-Bonjour!

As the new school opens and all the tasks fall quickly in our path, it's sometimes hard to keep the larger view of "non-basic" goals we have for our children. Luckily, on the issue of foreign language education, parents have mobilized support through Shepherd's Hola-Bonjour! group.

Admittedly, last year had some difficult times. With the recent changes in D.C. Public Schools affecting Shepherd directly, many felt deeply the loss of foreign language immersion attempted a few years back. With national standards acknowledged to require only 45 minutes a week of language education, there was concern Spanish would dip down to a minimum and French would be gone! But everyone pulled together; parents and school personnel alike found a way to meet school basics and insure more than minimum requirements of language. Foreign language education continues at Shepherd, perfectly complementing our International Baccalaureate program.

Last year's accomplishments:

- 1. Saturday Spanish and French language program
- 2. 5-week Spanish and French summer camps for Shepherd students
- 3. 3-year calendar commitment to Spanish and French at all levels (Thank you Principal Miles!)

And with a special grant from the Washington Ethical Society (located across 16th Street from Shepherd):

- 1. Textbooks purchased for French program
- 2. DVD players (playing DVDs produced in Europe) for both Spanish and French classes.

But all was not work: we also "rediscovered" the annual spring "International Children's Festival" (as well as other resources) of the International Meridian Center, (just off 16th Street).

'Songs of Freedom and Justice' CDs Still Available for Purchase

We still have a limited supply of CDs of "Songs of Freedom and Justice," last February's blockbuster musical revue written and staged by Shepherd Elementary's music teacher par excellence, Mr. Ken Giles. For those of you who weren't on hand for it, "Songs and Freedom and Justice" featured more than two dozen musical numbers ranging from slavery times to rock 'n' roll, with plenty of union songs, spirituals and blues in between. Mr. Giles used the CD and the script to promote the teaching of history through song this summer, at a D.C. convention of music educators and at the Conference on Creative Organizing in Silver Spring.

"Songs of Freedom and Justice" featured professional musicians, including Mr. Giles on guitar, providing accompaniment. It also features members of the D.C. Labor Chorus backing up some 80 Shepherd students on vocals. The performance, as well as the dress rehearsal prior, were both professionally recorded and mixed, giving the cleanest possible sound for live, on-location recording.

CDs cost \$10 each. They make a great document for your family and your neighbors. They also make great gifts for relatives and friends. 



For 2009-10, that's not good enough. You heard PTA president Charisse Brossard say it at the parent meeting: We want this year's directory out the first week of November.


