A Word from Mrs. Miles!

Welcome Back!

Thank you for an incredible first week of school. The students quickly transitioned back into the school year and have settled into what is bound to be a great year! Thank you for working diligently to prepare your student(s) for their first week of school. We could not do what we do if it was not for your support.

Morning Drop-Off

I can't complain because the students are getting here on time (yes!!!). However, please remember supervision is NOT available for students who are not enrolled in aftercare, or going to breakfast, until 8:25 a.m. If your student is in before-care, please do not drop them off before 7:30 a.m. I arrive between 7 and 7:15 a.m. and the students are greeting me when I pull up. Breakfast service begins at 8 a .m.

If your student is not in before-care and they are not going to breakfast, you may begin dropping off at 8:25 a.m. We are encouraging all parents to utilize the courtesy drop-off. Safety patrol and staff members will be available to escort students into the building. If you choose to walk your student inside, please do not park in front of the school. This is a fire safety hazard. Cars can and will be ticketed in the near future.

The curb along 14th street closest to the school is a no-parking zone between 8 a .m. and 3:30 p.m.

Afternoon Dismissal

Thank you for using the carpool during afternoon dismissal. This has eliminated lot of our office traffic. PLEASE let your child know how they are to go home each evening. The options are: Carpool (you will not come into the building, they are to meet you outside), Bus/Van, Walk or Pick-up by an adult. The term carpool is only for those students who will meet their parents outside at the car. Carpool numbers have been assigned. We will not be providing additional carpool numbers at this time.

The day ends at 3:15 p.m. Please be prompt when picking up your student. If you are going to be late consistently due to work, you must sign up for aftercare. I have not charged

anyone the \$5 late pick-up fee yet; however, the policy will go into effect next week, starting Tuesday, September 8. Here is our late policy:

Dismissal is at 3:15 p.m.; all parents are expected to be here at that time. After 3:30 p.m., parents will be charged a \$5 late pick-up fee for every 15 minutes you are late. For example, if you arrive at 3:35 p.m., you will be charged \$5; if you arrive at 3:50 p.m., you will be charged \$10; etc. The money collected will go toward student activities.

Forms and Folders

If your child did not receive a green communication folder, they will be provided one in the next couple of weeks. A temporary paper folder will be provided. School forms have been uploaded to the school site, if you have not completed these forms, please do so. Also, if things change (i.e. emergency contact information) please access the forms and update your information.

Instructional Update

Students from pre-K through second grade receive four blocks of language instruction a week, students in third grade receive three blocks, and students in fourth and fifth grade receive two blocks of language. Due to the fact that our second Spanish instructor has not arrived, Senor Velera is providing Spanish language instruction to all of the students who are on the Spanish track. He will continue this until our second language teacher arrives. Señorita Mojas made her appearance before the Embassy this week. She should be here by mid September.

Teachers have been working diligently to complete the writing of their International Baccalaureate units. They have also been making changes to Shepherds' Programme of Inquiry. On September 14, teachers will implement their first IB unit of the year.

I Lei You

The aim of all IB programmes is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and shared quardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world. IB learners strive to be:

<u>Inquirers</u> -- They develop their natural curiosity. They acquire the skills necessary to conduct inquiry and research and show independence in learning. They actively enjoy learning and this love of learning will be sustained throughout their lives.

<u>Knowledgeable</u> -- They explore concepts, ideas and issues that have local and global significance. In so doing, they acquire in-depth knowledge and develop understanding across a broad and balanced range of disciplines.

<u>Thinkers</u> -- They exercise initiative in applying thinking skills critically and creatively to recognize and approach complex problems, and make reasoned, ethical decisions.

<u>Communicators</u> -- They understand and express ideas and information confidently and creatively in more than one language and in a variety of modes of communication. They work effectively and willingly in collaboration with others.

<u>Principled</u> -- They act with integrity and honesty, with a strong sense of fairness, justice and respect for the dignity of the individual, groups and communities. They take responsibility for their own actions and the consequences that accompany them.

<u>Open-minded</u> -- They understand and appreciate their own cultures and personal histories, and are open to the perspectives, values and traditions of other individuals and communities. They are accustomed to seeking and evaluating a range of points of view, and are willing to grow from the experience.

<u>Caring</u> -- They show empathy, compassion and respect towards the needs and feelings of others. They have a personal commitment to service, and act to make a positive difference to the lives of others and to the environment.

<u>Risk-takers</u> -- They approach unfamiliar situations and uncertainty with courage and forethought, and have the independence of spirit to explore new roles, ideas and strategies. They are brave and articulate in defending their beliefs.

<u>Balanced</u> -- They understand the importance of intellectual, physical and emotional balance to achieve personal well-being for themselves and others.

Reflective -- They give thoughtful consideration to their own learning and experience. They are able to assess and understand their strengths and limitations in order to support their learning and personal development.

Each week we will highlight students and staff who are walking and talking the "IB way." When these individuals are recognized, they receive a colorful lei to wear around the building. As they see others walking the "IB way" they are to pass on their lei.

Mr. R. Beale (Pre-K Aide): Mrs. Beale showed her caring ways by volunteering to give up her duty-free period to assist on the play-ground during recess.

Mr. Sevaughn Coates (5th Grade Student): Mr. Coates showed that he is a thinker, he accidentally got off at the wrong Metro stop on the second day of school and lost his way. However, he did not give up and remained calm, focused, and determined. He thought critically about the problem he faced, made reasonable and ethical decisions. Ultimately he arrived here at Shepherd safe and eager to begin his day. (I must add... he was only 15 minutes late to school).

Catalog Fundraiser In Full Swing

We have two whole weeks of school out of the way! Whew!! And only three weeks left of our first fundraising opportunity of the year! Yikes!!!

Let's bring the "Year of Supporting Shepherd" in with a bang and the best part is you don't have to use your money! UOPM -- Use Other People's Money -- to help support Shepherd! Chances are the items that people buy are items they would be buying anyway...and this way they are helping our school in the process.

Most, if not all of you, have received the QSP (formerly Reader's Digest) Fundraising packets. Each student's minimum goal is only 15 items (but you don't have to stop there!). That way we reach our school goal of \$70,000 -- half of which we keep for the school and will go to the needs of Shepherd and our students. And, as always, the kid(s) with the highest order amount wins!! This year the two top winners will receive an Apple iTouch or a Nintendo DSi (respectively).

The selling part is easy! There are two ways to sell:

- * Use the order form and packet that was sent home, collect the money (checks or money orders - made out to Shepherd Elementary PTA preferred) and return the order form and the money by Wednesday September 23.
- * Or you can go to www.QSP.com, register your child and once the link is created e-mail that link to all your friends and family so they can start ordering (all items, including magazines). If you have family living out of town (or even in town), they can order online and it is shipped directly to them. With orders of \$60 or more the shipping is free (otherwise they pay for shipping). Your kid gets the credit (and a chance at the iTouch or DSi) and the school gets money! What a great way to Go Green! And Go Shepherd!!

Magazine note: If you are ordering magazines via the order form, just fill out the blue and white (main) order form to purchase a particular mag. It is actually quicker to do it online. If you do it through the order form they would have to wait until the orders come back then they get a voucher that they send in THEN they start to receive their magazines. If you do it online it starts almost immediately. The magazine postcard booklet is simply used as an offer for people that may like to purchase their magazines through the school. Fill in the names of friends and family and information will be mailed to them on how they can order magazines for themselves or as gifts to others.

You can also opt out of selling!

How? You can make a check for \$500 payable to Shepherd Elementary PTA, drop it off in the PTA box in the main office and -- or if you have already done so -- you can
