Student Behavior

In an earlier edition of the Mustang I talked about student behavior. I decided to bring this matter up again because the number of office referrals for behavior has doubled in the last two weeks. Every day a number of students are being referred to the office for behavior concerns. Usually, when the weather gets warmer, behavior problems increase. However, warm weather is not an excuse for inappropriate behavior. Please remind your student what is expected of them. Please tell them to stay away from conflict, choose their friends wisely, make good decisions, and seek the nearest adult if conflict finds them.

Also, parents please remember there are usually two sides to every story and in most cases no student is 100% innocent. Also, often times altercations occur due to misunderstandings. We are diligently working with our students to encourage them to use their words ("I don't like it when you." "Please do not." "It made me mad when you"). We also want them to use their manners and think before they react.

Things will get under way at 9 a.m. and will continue to 1 p.m. The school has wheelbarrows and some gardening implements. However, if you feel more comfortable using your own tools, you're welcome to bring them. A list is being developed of the tasks that can get done if we have a few green thumbs and many eager hands.

Remember to Register Your Child for 2010-11

Mrs. Miles said she hopes to get 100 percent registration from current Shepherd families for their children. Registrations must be done by the adults in person at the school so that school personnel can verify the family's D.C. residency, so don't return completed forms in a child's backpack – because it'll just be returned to you.

Why is registration important? Consider this: Current enrollment is 336. Our projected count for 2010-11 is 339. There is currently a wait list for ALL grades. All siblings are guaranteed entry, but not all neighborhood children. But if we get the registrations we expect to, then the numbers give us a shot at having an aide per grade for grades 1-5. With more success comes more students. With more students comes more opportunities for success. And success breeds itself.

Wanted: Parent Mentors

We need to welcome new families to the Shepherd Elementary experience and be ready to answer their questions – not to mention getting

them into the swing of thing. Already 10 parents have signed up to be mentors. But we're expecting close to 50 new families for the 2010-11 school year.
