The month of September is coming to a close very quickly. Next week is our week of reflection. As parents, teachers and students we will all take a moment to reflect on the Learner Profile trait of Caring and teachers and students will reflect on the current Program of Inquiry unit in the classroom. Parents, please be on the look out for your reflection sheet coming home with your child this week. We ask that you take a moment to reflect on moments of caring gestures and/or behaviors that you've observed from your child at home. Please send the reflection sheet back to school for the teacher to complete their reflection about your child.

To highlight the month of September and to recognize those students who have demonstrated the Learner Profile trait of Caring, Shepherd Elementary School will be holding its first Recognition Assembly. The assembly will be on September 30, 2010 in our gymnasium.

Hispanic Heritage Month began on September 15th and will continue until October 15th. Hispanic Heritage was acknowledge by Congress in 1968 and was originally designated as a one week celebration beginning on September 15th. However, in 1988, the celebration was extended to 31 days, to include Columbus Day (Oct. 12th) ending on October 15th.

Here at Shepherd each classroom has begun marking and celebrating Hispanic month in numerous ways:

Pre-K and Kindergarten classes have begun listening to stories about Hispanic Heritage

- 1st Grade through their Program of Inquiry Unit on "Map It", have been learning about explorers and will be learning about the Spanish astronaut Pedro Duque
- 2nd Grade has been learning about Christopher Columbus and will complete their study with a small play about Christopher Columbus. (More details to follow)
- 3rd Grade has been learning about Cesar Chavez and the movement of Social Justice through their Program of Inquiry Unit on "Yes We Can". This unit looks at systems of government around the world.
- 4th Grade Students will be choosing a Spanish Personality and conducting an inquiry Research on that Person.
- 5th Grade will be discussing the origins of Hispanic Heritage Month in relation to the natural resources of various Spanish speaking countries.

During October, the Learner Profile we will be focussing on is Inquirer. Have a Great Week!
