# PTA brick campaign is off to a solid start

The PTA's "Brick by Brick" paving program is in full swing. Those were some ideas of inscriptions YOU could put on YOUR brick. You're limited only by your imagination – and 18 characters per line (2 lines, with a optional 3rd line available)

Shepherd's two alumni Facebook groups have been notified about this Brick by Brick program. But let's show our alumni that the current crop of parents and teachers what they can do to be true to their school.

Remember: The bricks will line the walkway between the 14<sup>th</sup> Street sidewalk and the entrance to the original school building. The "basic" brick is \$50, but you can be an "Old School" supporter for \$100 and have your bricks placed closest to the steps. You can order an additional third line of text for \$15 extra, and you can get a duplicate brick for yourself to keep at home or work for \$39.95.

The "World Music and Dance" concert helps us be more international-minded and gives us a glimpse of other cultures. Lyric sheets will be on every chair so you can sing along with our students on February 9.

# Is my child too busy?

It's pretty common to hear parents talk about racing their child from one club sport, to the next—or to an academic debate, school club or other roster of activities. For some children, adding extracurricular activities may be due to the pressure of building a resume to get into a good college, while others feel peer pressure to hang out with a group of friends. Some parents might feel their child is "missing out" if he isn't constantly occupied. There are various reasons, but it all adds up to overload.
