



you will witness your child's teacher transitioning your student to class. In addition, all parents PK-5th are asked not to carry your child's bookbag and please do not assist them with unpacking and putting away their materials. This is your child's responsibility and it is the responsibility of our staff to put routines and procedures in place so students can do these things successfully. PK-K parents may continue escorting students until later in the school year. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated and please do not get offended when a staff member extends a friendly reminder.

Dismissal

The school day ends at 3:15. Please do not arrive early to pick up your student unless it is unavoidable. When possible, please schedule appointments after school or during holidays. If you need to pick your student up before dismissal, please arrive before 3:00 p.m. I have asked Mrs. Brooks not to call students to the office after 3:00. Two of the busiest times during the day is at arrival and dismissal. Our last instructional block officially ends at 3:10. Therefore, the last few minutes require students and staff members to focus so that they can 1) make it to the gymnasium on time and 2) assist students with gathering the necessary items so that they have a successful evening at home. Every call for a student interrupts the flow and if a student has to come to the office to be dismissed, two other students must stop what they are doing to help your child travel to the office safely because no student may travel alone.

Between 3:15 and 3:30 please note the following: aftercare students will be outside (in the cafeteria during inclement weather), carpool students will be in the hallway by the library and all other students will be in the gymnasium. If you need help finding your student, please ask a person holding a walkie-talkie. They can be found on the sidewalk, in the hallway by the library or in the gymnasium.
