Paced Interim Assessments

This past week students in 2nd through 5th grade completed their first Paced Interim Assessment, better known as PIA. These assessments measure how well students have mastered and how well teachers have taught a set of standards during a 6 week time period. These assessments will help drive future instruction. During Parent-Teacher conferences you will have an opportunity to view your student's results and it is my hope you and your child's teacher will develop a plan outlining how you can help at home. There are a lot of great staff members at Shepherd; however if our students are going to reach their fullest potential, Shepherd staff cannot do it alone. It is a team effort!


as our outdoor classroom seats and picnic table auxiliarity. So wear clothes that you can risk getting paint on. Bring the family and neighbors as well!

On Friday, September 30, Shepherd Elementary students participated in a recycling presentation in the auditorium. It was a magic show, too! The presenter's name was Mr. McCloud. He taught us about what happens to the planet when people do not recycle.

Mr. McCloud also shared some things about composting. Compost is made of leftover foods, dead leaves and grass, and also fruit and vegetable scraps that you leave outside. It is not recommended to use meat. Over time, the sun and the rain change the mix into mulch that is good for plants to grow. According to web site www.HowToCompost.org, composting is simply decomposed natural material.

Fellow Mustangs, I encourage you to ask the adults you live with to help you with recycling, and composting at home so our world becomes green.

STANDING UP FOR TRAFFIC SAFETY

Let us now offer a big thank you to all of the parents, caregivers, staff and neighbors who have taken our six-point Shepherd traffic safety pledge. Those six points are:

- 1. Not stopping or parking in a crosswalk
- 2. Parking only in a legal space
- 3. Stopping for pedestrians in the crosswalk
- 4. Following the speed limit
- 5. Making only legal turns (no illegal U-turns)
- 6. Letting students out only on the curb side of the car

There were very few people who, when offered a chance to sign the traffic safety pledge, refused to do so. More often than not, the parent volunteers who were soliciting signatures two weeks ago ran out of pledge forms to sign. Numbers greater than these signed the Local School Advisory Team's traffic safety petition, which asks the D.C. government to:

- Assign an additional crossing guard to the corner of 14th and Jonquil Streets NW.
- ♦ Increase ticket patrol on 14th Street NW between Kalmia Road NW and Jonquil St. NW between 8-10 a.m. and 2:30-4:30 p.m.
- Make 14th Street NW a one way going south between Kalmia and Jonquil.
- Put "Stop for Pedestrians in Crosswalk" signs at all crosswalks surrounding school.

"Sometimes the simplest ideas are the most profound. "Take those kids outside!"? This simple idea has become a river into which some very robust streams of thought are pouring, streams which draw from the watersheds of environmental education, education reform, human ecology and beyond. While the schoolyard as wildlife habitat is a major current in the schoolyard movement, it does not define it. Nor is science the only subject that benefits. There is also a strong current flowing around gardening, emphasizing the cultivation of plants as a window into literature, nutrition, history and math.

"The schoolyard movement flows from a concern that has echoed through environmental education literature: the belief that the next generation absolutely must possess a fundamental ecological literacy if it is to have a chance of dealing with such daunting challenges as global warming and the loss of biodiversity and other natural resources." - Stephen R. Coffee, Executive Director of Arlingtonians for a Clean Environment.



Music classes have studied several interesting topics in recent weeks. Here are three of them:

1. "Route 66." First graders listened to jazz song made famous by Nat King Cole, "Route 66," learned about the geography and the towns from Chicago to Los Angeles, and drew maps of the famous "Route 66" highway. Check out some beautiful maps on the wall outside the music room.

- 2. We made drums from metal cans donated by Ledo Pizza, and we played diembe rhythms on our homemade drums. Photos of our students making drums are on the wall outside the music room and on display at Ledo's Pizza on Georgia Avenue.
- 3. Paul Robeson, the great singer, actor, and civil rights activist, is still NOT in our D.C. Public Schools music textbooks. The censorship from the 1950s continues mainly because few have demanded that things change. After studying Paul Robeson's music and what happened to him, our students wrote about why Paul Robeson should be in our music texts. Samples of our student writing will be on the wall outside the music room and will be presented to DCPS officials.

The Learner Profile trait for October is **Inquirer**. An inquirer is someone who is curious about the world around them. They acquire the skills necessary to conduct inquiry and research and show independence in learning. They actively enjoy learning and this love of learning is sustained throughout their lives.

INQUIRERS in Language Arts are People who inquire and use language as the main way to learn about language and do it through language.

INQUIRERS in Mathematics are fascinated by the world of patterns, shape, and number and use the skills of mathematics to conduct purposeful inquiry.

INQUIRERS in Science & Technology have a sense of wonder about the physical and the material world. They wonder how it works and uses the scientific process to conduct purposeful inquiry.

INQUIRERS in Social Studies inquire into their own and others' cultural heritages, historical and geographical influences on individuals, groups, and social systems. They inquire about society and culture.

How can parents help to develop students who are Inquirers at home?

- **Encourage** areas of your child's interest by visiting the library to borrow books that explore these topics.
- Develop an understanding of the Internet. Work with your son or daughter when the Internet is being used and try to instill the understanding that some Internet sites are not reputable.
- Model being an inquirer. Admit when you don't know the answer to a problem or a question and seek out answers in front of your child.

◆ Catch your child being an inquirer. Make sure your child knows he/she has done something good. Expressing your approval is a powerful way to reinforce

Your Guide to Supporting SES FALL FEST 2011

- 1. Admission to FALL FEST is free and open to all!
- 2. Ride and Activity Tickets must be purchased at the central ticket booths.
 - Tickets are required for games and activities (classroom booths).
 - Tickets may be used for rides and food.
 - Tickets are not accepted in Vendor Row (school auditorium).
 - Tickets are sold for \$1 each.
 - Ticket booths accept cash and checks. The indoor ticket booth will accept credit cards.

3. Moon Bounce and Bungee Rides:

- 3 tickets per ride (reduced from last year's price).
- Tickets booths will sell wristbands for \$20, entitling the wearer to unlimited rides until 4 p.m.

4. Games and Activities:

- Prices vary and will be posted at each booth.
- Games and activities must be paid with tickets.
- Wristbands are not accepted for games and activities.

5. Food and Beverages:

- Prices vary according to item.
- The food concession will accept cash or tickets.
- The food concession will not accept credit cards, but you can use a credit card to purchase tickets.

6. Vendor Row

- Vendor Row will feature a variety of local vendors.
- Any purchases made on Vendor Row will be paid directly to the vendor, in a manner acceptable to the vendor.

should be on board by mid October. She has completed all the steps which will allow her to join our staff as a full-time substitute. We are now waiting on Office of State Superintendent of Education to issue her substitute license. In the meantime Ms. Johnson, a substitute teacher, has been working to make sure our students receive Spanish instruction each week.

Art Part-Time

It was brought to my attention that some families did not realize art is a part-time position. This was a collaborative decision made by members of the school's Local School Advisory Team (LSAT) at the end of last school year. The collapse of the art teacher position from full-time to a part-time position was one of several cuts made as a result of budget cuts across the District. The good news, students in grades 1st through 5th grade continue to receive art instruction once a week for 45 minutes as in previous years. Students in grades PK and K receive 45 minutes of art instruction every other week. However, their days are filled with "art" opportunities. Our youngest learners are always drawing, modeling, painting, coloring and creating.
