

Free Sunday Tutoring Program Starts in Sept.

The Shepherd-TI Tutoring program is about to start its 15th year serving Shepherd Elementary students. Once again, the program will be providing free weekly tutoring to Shepherd Elementary students and we are starting to recruit this year's group of tutees.

The program meets every Sunday (except holiday weekends) at Tifereth Israel, the local synagogue at the corner of 16th and Juniper Streets. The tutors are mostly members of the synagogue and their teenage children, although we also have many tutors from the community and from other neighborhoods. (In fact, as discussed below, we are also looking to recruit additional tutors.) We match up a tutor and a student for the entire year, and they form a delightful relationship that helps fuel the learning. Every week the tutors work with their students on math, reading, vocabulary, current homework, or anything that the child's parent or teacher thinks would be helpful. Our goal is not to teach anything advanced, but to reinforce the lessons learned in school, and to try to add a little fun to doing schoolwork on the weekend. This year, the program starts on Sunday, Sept. 23.

Last year was the most successful in the history of the program. More than 30 students participated, and many new tutors joined the program. Many parents send their children back year after year for the program, because they find that it does encourage the students in their learning.

The program is run by Shepherd Park neighbor Dan Nathan, whose two daughters attended Shepherd Elementary, and who works closely with the school in putting on the program. In the past, some of the program's tutors have come from the families of Shepherd students, such as their parents or older siblings; volunteering in the program is a good source of community service credits. Shepherd Safety Patrol to Hold First Meeting Friday

Safety at Shepherd Elementary has been a continuous concern of parents, and also a priority for Shepherd's Local School Advisory Team. Yet despite petitions and reviews and complaints, D.C. hasn't done a thing. So, if the city won't do something about student safety in getting to school, then we will!

Safety Patrol training for Shepherd students will be held Friday, Aug. 31, at 11 a.m.

But, in addition to the trained student safety patrollers, we will need parent volunteers to serve as Assistant Supervisors. This is a yearlong commitment. These individuals would help monitor patrols in the mornings (roughly 8:15-8:45 a.m.) and afternoons (roughly 3-3:30 p.m.); participate in patrol-related activities/ parties and trips -- on a rotating basis if necessary; and attend the Aug. 31 training.

Ms. Holt, who will be the faculty leader of the safety patrol, will also help with the morning and afternoon monitoring, but she will need some coverage on the days when she is scheduled to attend school staff meetings and trainings that conflict with these times. Ms. Holt will also hold weekly meetings to take place during a pre-agreed-upon time during the school day. These are optional meetings for the Assistant Supervisors because Ms. Holt can easily update them via email. Letters to fourth and fifth-graders who have been selected for Safety Patrol membership have already been mailed.

- "Holiday Concert" on Wednesday, Dec. 5, 6:45 p.m., Shepherd Elementary auditorium. D.C.'s Grammy-nominated beatboxer Christylez will rap with Shepherd's violinists to Pachelbel's Canon. Free.

On Friday, Aug. 31, students whose last name begins with L-Z attend school for a full day, and students whose last names begin with A-K stay home. The first day for all pre-K students is Tuesday, Sept. 4. The first three days of early Childhood Transition Week are reserved for families to meet with their child's teacher. A representative from the school will contact you to schedule your parentstudent-teacher conference.

Pay Your Instructional Fees

In addition to school supplies, there is also an instructional fee of \$20 per student. This fee covers the cost of arts and crafts materials for the younger students, communication folders, My Weekly Reader, Time for Kids, National Geographic magazines and student agendas. The fees will also help offset the cost of instructional websites (i.e. Starfall, Study Island, LearnZillion, First in Math, and others) used in classrooms. You can pay them on the first day of school. If you read this after the first day of school and have not paid the fee, please go to the office to make your payment.

Safety First at Shepherd

Please help us to be good neighbors. The traffic flow around the school is clockwise; that means making right turns whenever possible – so adjust your route to school to enable you to make only right turns.

The passenger door should always open to the curb for safety reasons. Make sure to park legally; be aware of blocking driveways and walking in our neighbors' yards.

Look elsewhere in this issue of the Mustang for news of the Safety Patrol students and the call for adult helpers for them.

Obey the instructions of the traffic guard at the intersection of Kalmia and 14th.

Whether walking or driving, give yourself enough time to get to school not only on time, but safely as well.

Please refrain from bringing your dog up to the school; pets are to remain off the school grounds. If you must bring your dog for some reason, please keep it on a leash across the street. Be considerate of children and adults who may be allergic and/or uncomfortable around animals. Parents: Please share this information with your babysitters and nannies.

All other students are dismissed at 3:15 p.m. Parents choosing to walk into the building and physically pick up their student(s) should report directly to the gymnasium. The gym doors will open at 3:10 p.m. Your student will meet you in the gymnasium.

EARLY DISMISSAL

In the event that your student needs to be dismissed early, please notify your child's teacher in writing. In addition, please arrive before 3 p.m. No students will be called for dismissal from the main office between 3 and 3:30 p.m. If you arrive during this time to pick up your student, they can be found in one of the following locations: Aftercare- Cafeteria, Carpool –Library, Everyone Else- Gymnasium.

VISITORS

All guests (parents included) must sign in at the security desk. You must present ID and obtain a visitor's badge. The badge should be worn at all times. When you exit the building, you must exit via the main entrance, sign out and return your visitor's badge. PLEASE DO NOT EXIT OUT ANY DOOR EXECPT THE MAIN ENTRANCE DOOR!!!!

BREAKFAST and LUNCH

Breakfast and after-school supper are free for all DCPS students. All students are expected to pay for their lunch unless an application for Free And Reduced Meals (FARM) is completed and received by October 1.

Meal Payment

All lunch meals must be paid for in advance of service. Students and school staff can prepay for meals three ways:

- 1) By bringing cash or check made payable to the D.C. Treasurer to the cafeteria staff before, inbetween, or after meal periods.*
- 2) By inserting cash into a MyPAL Kiosk, located in or just outside of the school cafeteria (if applicable).
- By paying with a credit or debit card at <u>mylunchmoney.com</u>**, an online prepayment service.
- *As of Aug. 22, 2011, DCPS does not take cash during meal service.
- **Parents or guardians will be charged a \$1.95 fee per transaction.

FREE AND REDUCED MEALS APPLICATION (FARM)

Each student received a FARM application on Monday (August 27) in their Monday communication folder. All parents must complete and return the form. If you are not interested in applying for Free and Reduced Meals, please write your name on the form along with the word DECLINED across the top. WE MUST RECEIVE A FORM FROM EVERY STUDENT.

SCHOOL DISCIPLINE POLICY

This year our school will implement a new school-wide discipline policy. The full policy will be available on our school website at the end of the week and all parents and students will receive an abbreviated copy of the policy on Wednesday. Please take time to familiarize yourself with the policy.

COMMUNICATION FOLDERS

Monday is the official communication day at Shepherd. Each week your student will bring home important information in their folders. Please take time to review the contents of the folder and return the items that need to be returned. The folders have a picture of the world surrounded by students holding hands on the cover. The folder may come home several times during the first week.
