Greetings Shepherd Families!

#### Focus on Reading

A few weeks ago our teachers finished administering the first round of reading assessments and the results are as follows: 77 percent of our Kin-

dergarten through fifth-grade students are reading at or above grade level, 10 percent are below grade level, and 13 percent are significantly below grade level. Our first round of data looks good; however, we still have a long ways to go. Our challenge is to move students out of the below-basic and basic category into the proficient category and continue to provide support for the proficient and advanced students so that they will continue to make gains as we raise expectations and the work gets more challenging.

#### What About All the Other Subjects?

Though our focus is on reading, we have not forgotten about our other subjects. Students are engaged in daily writing activities and at the end of each unit of study students are expected to produce a writing piece.

In math, third- through fifth-grade students are increasing their problem-solving skills through the use of Spatial Temporal Math. In addition, students in kindergarten through fifth grade are working to increase their math fluency and application skills through the use of First in Math. Teachers are working with students to help them to become proficient problem solvers who are able to apply mathematical skills and concepts across disciplines. ### Vote! It's Your Civic Duty

Tuesday, Nov. 6, is Election Day in D.C. and across

the whole United States. But you probably saw stories about the long, long lines on the first day of "early voting" in the District. That's not a surprise. People are eager to vote and are eager to make their voice heard in the political process.



The time for early voting is over, but polls will be open 7 a.m.-8 p.m. in Washington. If you are in line at 8 p.m., you are allowed to vote. Unlike SOME states, D.C. does NOT require photo ID to be able to vote. All you have to do is show proof of residency. You may have kept the voter registration card issued by the D.C. government earlier this year. Even a utility bill works as proof of residency!

If you are an "in-boundary" parent at Shepherd, then it's likely that Shepherd Elementary, Precinct 62, is your polling place. But you should be prepared for long lines as many D.C. residents experienced four years ago. Perhaps you want to bring your children with you inside the auditorium, where voting takes place, to show them how you put democracy into action. But wherever you vote, make sure you vote. Your voice and your vote count!

Shepherd students who have caught election fever will vote for Student Council officers this Friday. We hope to have the winners in the next issue of the Mustang.

### LSAT Meets Nov. 13

Shepherd's Local School Advisory Team will have its next meeting Tuesday, Nov. 13, at 4 p.m. at the school. While the agenda has not been fixed yet, there will be discussion about the LSAT's three main priority areas: culture and climate, academic enrichment, and community engagement. Expect to hear some more on traffic and pedestrian safety, as well as follow-up from the October meeting on such items as a park-and-walk option for some Shepherd families, volunteer help for the library, a kickball team coach, volunteer "mystery readers" for the school's "Get Caught Reading" initiative, finding neighborhood volunteers to place traffic cones on 14th Street, updating the school website, and an effort to get volunteers fingerprinted at Shepherd rather than have to go downtown for fingerprinting.

#### **PTA Fundraising Committee Forming**

At last month's PTA meeting, parents voted to commit \$11,000 from the PTA

#### The 180 Fund Supports Our Kids; Now, It's Your Turn to Support the 180 Fund

The 180 Fund was created three years ago to replace PTA dues and the "Family Enrichment Fee." This kept the school from being a havesvs.-have-nots divide among parents based on who paid PTA dues. Parents took to the 180 Fund like a duck to water, bringing more financial support to the school than PTA dues and the Family Enrichment Fee ever could. That money has resulted in the purchase of all of the computers in the computer lab, office supplies, a tarp for our auditorium floor, and the lion's share of the "Afternoon Academy" concept two years ago to boost test scores - which it did.

This year's PTA leadership has committed \$1,000 per grade level, and \$500 per "specials" classroom, to help fund needs and activities not covered in the school budget. That's \$11,000 -more than was originally budgeted for 180 Fund revenues for the 2012-13 school year.

This is why we need you -- as PTA members, as parents --- to support the 180 Fund. To support

the educational Shepherd's students takes more than just good intentions. Pull out your checkbook. Fill out the 180 Fund form at the

If we put them in a room full of craft supplies or Lego blocks, we will see their imaginations come to life. Teachers have a challenge to find and keep that spark in the classroom and parents your challenge is to do the same at home. Curiosity fosters thinking. We can stimulate student's curiosity by:

- Building activities around their interests, their preferences, and around their sense of challenge.
- Acknowledging them as we listen to their thoughts and respond to what they care about.

When curiosity is present we know students are thinking. Help students make meaningful connections to validate their thinking.

#### Arrival and Dismissal

I am happy to see so many families arriving to school on time. Our tardiness rate has decreased significantly. However, we still have many families who continue to arrive to school after the gymnasium doors close. If you do not enter the school via the gymnasium you are late. When students arrive late they must check in with Ms. Brooks at the main office or Officer Johnson at the security desk. Students arriving at 9 a.m. must be escorted into the building by an adult. **DO NOT SEND YOUR STUDENT INTO THE SCHOOL ALONE!!!** School dismisses at 3:15 p.m., so please arrive on time.

#### Parking Enforcement

Did you notice the Parking Enforcement parked in front of the school on Friday? Well, if not, they are out. They are looking for individuals who are parking illegally (parking and leaving their cars unattended) in front of the school between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. The space in front of the school is for drop-off
