beginning of the year is always my favorite time of year and I am very excited about what is to come. We are well on our way to a wonderful school year!

### **Safety First**

Drop-Off: If you do not walk your student into the gymnasium at arrival, you must drop off on 14th Street at the curb next to the school. Please do not drop off in any other area or street. There are Safety Patrol and staff members available to make sure students enter the building safely. Please pull to the curb, let your student out on the curb side and keep moving. Students should have their materials in hand and goodbyes should be brief. This will help keep the line moving and the area from becoming congested. Cars left unattended will be ticketed!

<u>Transportation Changes</u>: If your child is leaving the school in a way different than normal, we MUST have a note with a signature from the custodial parent or guardian.

End-of-day pick-up: No student will be dismissed from the office between 3 and 3:30 p.m. Please note the following dismissal locations and where students can be found. Aftercare – cafeteria; Carpool – 14th Street entrance; Students whose parents come for them – gymnasium. At 3:30, students who have not been picked up can be found in the hallway where the main office is located.

Shepherd Elementary is entering its fifth year of cell phone recycling. And we've been recycling computer-printer toner cartridges for even longer.

With every 10 cell phones that we receive in the office for recycling, another eco-friendly Shepherd parent (just like you) can ship them to a California

company that can
"harvest" the
technology in each
phone for reuse in
other phones, thus
tamping down the
demand for the
"earth metals"
needed in every cell
phone. Even the



most basic of cell phones will net Shepherd two bucks, and with cell phones being switch by their users every 22 months, it makes perfect sense to recycle them through the school. Just deposit those unwanted cell phones in the PTA box in the school office.

The same goes for toner cartridges. We bundle up a batch and send them for refilling and/or recycling, depending on the cartridge sent. Just hand them over to Ms. Brooks in the school office. On behalf of the school and of the planet, than you for your help!

through fifth grade have been filled. The remaining 20 slots are for our Pre-K students only. If you are a parent of a Pre-Ker and you would like for your child to participate in carpool, please sign up in the main office no later than Friday.

Arrival: Please do not walk your student to their classroom. We have staff members monitoring the hallways so rest assured that your little one(s) will make it to class safely. In an effort to teach our students independence as well as to make sure that everyone is safe within the building... we are strongly urging that all students who are walked into the school be kissed goodbye at the gymnasium door.

<u>Visiting the Building</u>: To enter the building one must report to the main office and sign in at the security desk. No parent/guardian/visitor will be permitted into the building without signing in and receiving a visitor's badge. When exiting the building, please exit through the main entrance only.

#### **Shepherd FAQs**

### Q: My child has allergies, special dietary restrictions or needs medication (prescription or non prescription medication) administered at school what steps do I take?

A: You must personally see the nurse and complete the paperwork that is kept in her office. This must be done even if you have notified the child's teacher and/or the main office.

#### Q: What is carpool and how do I participate?

A: Carpool provides parents with the convenience of pulling in front of the school at dismissal and waiting beside the curb until their child exits the building. This keeps parents from having to find a parking space in the afternoon, get out of their car and walk into the gymnasium to pick up their students. All remaining spots are for our pre-K students.

# Q: Do parents have to walk their child into the building each morning? Will my child be safe?

A: Parents may pull to the curb in front of the school and let their student out of the car. There will be Safety Patrol and adults visible each morning between 8:30 and 8:45 a.m. to make sure your student gets into the building safely.

#### Q: What time may I begin dropping off my students?

A: The building opens for students who are not participating in before-care, our breakfast program or another morning activity at 8:30 a.m. Please refrain from bringing/dropping your student off before this time. Safety is a priority and there is no guarantee supervision will be available before 8:30.

#### Q: What time does the day officially began?

A: The instructional day begins at 8:45 a.m. Any student arriving after this time is considered tardy. Students who arrive late must be escorted into the building and be signed in by an adult.

#### Q: How do I know that my student is late?

A: If the gym doors are closed, your student is late and must enter through the main entrance and be escorted by a parent. *Q: How do students enter the building in the morning?* 

A: Students who arrive early for breakfast or aftercare should be escorted by a parent downstairs to the cafeteria. All other students should enter the building through the gymnasium beginning at 8:30 a.m.

#### Q: Who do I see about before- and aftercare?

A: Ms. Riley is the aftercare coordinator. She will be in the building most of the day during the first week. After the first week her hours in the building are 7:30-9 a.m. and 2-6:30 p.m. She may also be reached by phone by calling the main office at 202-576-6140.

#### Q: How does the lunch program work?

A: Parents (whose students does not qualify for free and/or reduced-price lunch) are encouraged to create a lunch account and put money on their student's account. The account will be debited each time your child makes a food purchase. You may also pay by cash by using the kiosk located in the cafeteria.
