


# Four-Day Weekend for Students

# Garden Soup: Yum!

Ms. Johnson's second-grade class welcomed a chef on the final day of its "Plants Are Everywhere" IB unit. The chef discussed different Winter Squash grown during this time of the year. The children participated in a question-and-answer session and had the opportunity to identify

four different types of Winter Squash the chef brought along. These included butternut squash, acorn squash, spaghetti squash and -- you guessed it -- pumpkin. The chef then performed a cooking demonstration of butternut squash soup. The students were risk-takers, and truly enjoyed their servings. Some students went back for third and fourth helpings. In the end, each student was sent home with an information booklet about Winter Squash and the soup recipe. Some of Shepherd's staff also enjoyed the soup. The chef was so pleased with Ms. Johnson's students and their level of interest and participation, he's vowed to return as early as Ms. Johnson will have him back. He's even willing to carve animal figures out of fresh fruits and vegetables the next time around.

This chef, invited by Kennedy Harrison's mom, actually participates in a D.C. government and federally funded outreach program to teach the Washington community about healthy eating. He is currently assigned to about 14 D.C. public schools and child development centers. The high-tech stovetop he uses is flameless and features a cool-touch technology to prevent any fire or burn incidents. Student food allergies are always considered in his decision of what ingredients are safe to use.

#### **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

By now you should have received a conference request from your child's teacher. If not, stop now and send your teacher an email. Parent-Teacher conferences are scheduled for next Monday, Oct. 21. I am expecting 100% participation.

#### 90/80/90/90

Do you know your students' reading level? Do you know what goals your students have set and their plans for reaching their goals? If not, ask your student. Every student in first through fifth grade should know their reading level, and every student at Shepherd is expected to have a goal that they are working toward. At your parent-teacher conference you will learn more about this goal, and at the curriculum meeting scheduled for Nov. 6 you will learn more about how to help your student reach their goal. Our school goals are ambitious; however, we know with the help of parents we can meet and exceed our goals.

### **Reading Strategy - Summarization**

To summarize means that students are able to share the most important details about the text while leaving out all the irrelevant details. You can help your student at home by using the Somebody-Wanted-But-So-Then Strategy for Narrative Text and using the 3, 2, 1 Summarization Strategy for Informational Text.

#### Strategy for Narrative Summary: SWBST

Somebody (identify the character(s)
Wanted (describe the character's goal)
But (describe a conflict that hinders the character)
So (describe how the character reacts to the conflict)
Then (describe the resolution of the conflict)

#### 3, 2, 1 Strategy for Summarizing Informational Text:

- 3 Things I learned
- 2 Interesting Things
- 1 Questions I Still Have

## Renovations Update

Shepherd's School Improvement Team met Oct. 2 to assess progress made thus far and to chart the course for the future.

All of the renovations promised to be made over the summer were done on time. School Improvement Team members saw a slide show of what particular areas of the school had looked like, followed by an artist's rending of what the renovated space would look like, then a photograph of the renovated room. Nice touches were the fence around the tot lot

There are still a few things left to do, such as install bulletin boards or cork strips on which to affix students' projects, and to install new, permanent doors in certain areas of the building.

The renovation of the ground floor, which will house the library, computer lab, language classrooms and teachers' lounge, has stilled by —guess what? — the federal government shutdown. However, once the money is flowing again, crews will return to Shepherd to work before and after school hours. It is less likely, though, that the new ground floor space will be completed by winter break, as hoped.

While there was much praise over the renovations – a sure sign of success was the reported jealousy of one teacher who's not in a renovated classroom — there were a few bugs in the system. Teachers weren't given all the boxes they were promised to have to pack their things in advance of the renovation. One teacher said boxes containing about \$2,000 in classroom materials never made their way back to Shepherd. And the nap mats for Shepherd's youngest students have proven to be difficult to store and put covers on, thus robbing the students of a chance to learn how to do things more independently.

The next meeting of the School Improvement Team will be Wednesday, Nov. 6, 5 -6 p.m., at school. Let me know if you have any bouquets or brickbats about the renovations that have been done, or work yet to do.


