Occasionally throughout the year, usually in the spring and at the start

DC-CAS

Starting this week, students in third, fourth and fifth grade will take the District of Columbia Comprehensive Assessment (DC-CAS). This assessment is given annually to students to see how well they have mastered grade-level content. The results from these assessments are used to measure and compare Shepherd to other schools.

The reading and math assessments for third through fifth grade will take place Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Students in fourth grade will take the writing assessment on Monday, April 7. Our fifthgrade students will take the Health and Science assessment Monday-Tuesday, April 7-8. Testing will begin each morning at 9:30 a.m. and will end when students are done.

Please make sure that your student gets a good night's rest, arrives to school on time well-fed (or earlier
