I hope you are well. Time is passing quickly. We may only have seven more weeks remaining in this school year; however, we have a lot more learning to do and activities planned. Two things we are doing


School Improvement Team to Meet May 8

Frequently Asked Questions:

When do we register for next year?

Before- and aftercare registration will be online and available through the mail on August 1. Some grades may fill up, so please do register early; we will keep a waiting list if necessary. Or, we will create split classes to accommodate all who need aftercare.

Why do we pay for the days when we are on vacation or school is out?

Before- and aftercare operates on a nine-month payment schedule -- nine equal payments to make it easier. Because families do not pay for the first week of school in August (there is only one payment for August-September) and do pay for December and April vacations, there is NO TUITION IN JUNE if you have paid all nine months (if you are behind in payments, or have not been enrolled full-time for all nine months you will receive a statement with the amount you owe). And remember, the childcare service is less than \$4 per hour and we are improving our program and activities each year!

Nomination Window Closing for PTA, LSAT

Taking leadership and taking responsibility for school matters is everybody's business. It's parents who vote for PTA and Local School Advisory Team candidates to lead the entire parent body. It's parents who nominate other parents to these positions of responsibility — even when they step up to nominate themselves. And it's parents who collaborate with school staff to make Shepherd the best school it can be.

The PTA officer positions are:

- ♦ President
- ♦ First Vice President
- ♦ Second Vice President
- ♦ Recording Secretary
- ♦ Corresponding Secretary
- ♦ Treasurer
- ♦ Assistant Treasurer

There are also four parent representative positions on the LSAT.

All offices are one-year terms, and parents may serve in the same office for two years in a row.

The PTA's Nominations Committee has established a deadline of Thursday, May 15, for accepting nominations. At that point, all nominees must have submitted a candidate statement that can be posted on the PTA listserv, published in the May 19 issue of the Mustang, and made into a special Candidates' Guide for parents to review.

LSAT elections will be conducted Wednesday, May 21, at Shepherd regardless of the number of nominees, to allow for write-in voting. Balloting will be conducted 7:30-9 a.m. and 3-6:30 p.m. — outdoors by the 14th Street sidewalk if it's good weather, inside school near the security desk if it's bad weather.

If there are contested races for PTA officer positions, those elections would be conducted during the PTA meeting at 6:30 p.m. also on May 21.
