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

Neighborhood Yard Sale Next Weekend



Is your child going to the Spring Jammy Jam this Friday, June 6? PLEASE FILL OUT AND RETURN THE YELLOW PERMISSION SLIP. YOUR CHILD MUST HAVE PERMISSION TO ATTEND --AND A TICKET. A note to pre-K and kindergarten parents: We do not take younger students to the dance; we have a pizza/movie party in the library instead. If you would like your child to attend, please sign them out of aftercare, or email sesstarachievers@gmail.com and let us know who will sign your child out and take them to the dance.

NEXT YEAR: Registration for 2014-15 before- and aftercare will be available online starting Aug. 1 through Aug.15. You may register Aug. 18–22 at school. First-day-of-school registration is also available beginning at 8 a.m. on Monday, Aug. 25

Frequently asked questions:

How much is tuition and how do I pay? Registration is \$45 (non-refundable) per family and one-child aftercare only is \$240 per month; before- and aftercare is \$270 per month. Two-child aftercare only is \$420 per month. Although these rates applied to this past school year, the tuition will be raised only slightly if at all. Further tuition information can be found on the school website on Aug. 1. Your first payment covers Aug. and Sept. Your next payment is due Oct 1. We accept credit cards online only, and money orders or checks. We do not accept cash.

Do you have part-time care? No, we do not have the ability to offer part-time care, however, we have a drop-in service -- which you can use twice per month -- to cover urgent needs. The cost is \$30 per drop in.

Do you pro-rate tuition if I use only part of a month? No, our service is for families who use the service full-time, and we budget for approximately 15 students for each class each month. If you begin a month late or leave the service early you will not receive any rebate.

PTA Meeting Highlights

It's a time of transition, as current PTA officers took some final bows, and new PTA officers were ushered in during the May 21 PTA meeting.

Interest was more stoked than anticipated. Not enough copies of the PTA meeting agenda and supporting materials were made, and fresh copies had to be made quickly. This mirrored parent voting for Local School Advisory Team members; the print run of 100 ballots were all used up before voting closed. Parents took to circling names on the Candidates Guide to indicate their choices before fresh ballots could be made!

New members Eve Lotter, Jim Elliott and Aeva Doomes join returning incumbent Keith White on the LSAT. For the Shepherd PTA, Curtis Lewis returned as treasurer for a second year, and Laura Levine was re-elected to a second year as corresponding secretary. Leonie Stephenson moved from recording secretary to first vice president. David Trimble was elected PTA president, Cara Biddle second vice president, Alesha Dominique recording secretary, and Allison Boehm assistant treasurer. At the meeting, David said he wants to engage new families to develop a new generation of parent leaders for Shepherd.

Plans were announced — and made more concrete — for a variety of events at school ranging from last week's Field Day and "Pop-In and Preview" sessions for new parents to upcoming happenings like the Fifth Grade Exhibition and their promotion ceremony.

Katherine Trimble reported on a meeting held in mid-May regarding education in Ward 4. While a movement is afoot to get D.C. Public Schools to reopen the closed-last-year McFarland Middle School as a middle school to serve the southern part of the ward, it will likely be years before there is a stand-alone middle school for students in the northern part of the ward. Under the school boundary redrawing options presented in April, one option has Shepherd still feeding to Deal Middle School; another would let parents choose between Deal and a new middle school to serve upper Ward 4; while the third jettisons all "neighborhood" distinctions and makes attendance at every D.C. public school subject to a lottery.

Eve Lotter promoted the Growing Together tutoring program held at the Shepherd Park Library. The program will offer tutoring over the summer at the library.

Mrs. Miles, the principal, pushed parents to fill out the Safe Routes to School traffic survey, either online or a paper version distributed for backpacks. (See separate story in the Mustang with a link to the online survey.)

Before the meeting was adjourned, the current group of PTA officers were showered with lusty applause for a job well done!



