Literacy Night October 30, 2014 at 6 PM



STAFF:

- We are happy to have **Ms. Yolanda Bush** back. She is responsible for the **PS 3 class** and has served as a teacher's aide at Shepherd. Her son attended Shepherd and is now an 8th grader at Deal Middle School. She is a warm and helpful staff member as well as the Spanish teacher.
- Ms. Shenita Lee has been in aftercare teaching the Pre K class for 8 years and enjoys arts and crafts with the children.
- Ms. Angelica Akers, who has a daughter at Shepherd, is new to Star Achievers but has aftercare experience in DC. She will be a co-teacher of the Pre K class and is currently the Shepherd teacher's aide to Ms. Pethtel in Kindergarten.
- Ms. Nicole Pethtel, a Kindergarten teacher at Shepherd provides a specials class once a week for the **PS 3** and **Pre K 4 classes** and twice a week to **Kindergarteners** she leads art, music, reading and outdoor activities.
- The **Kindergarten class** has two teachers: **Ms. Abouattier** (Monday, Wednesday, and Friday), who has experience in aftercare programs as well as with teaching French; and **Ms. Lester** (Tuesday and Thursday) a teacher's aide at Shepherd, teaches with a flair for the performing arts.
- The **first grade** teacher is **Ms. Arrington**, who also teaches first grade at Shepherd during the day except Wednesdays when she is the **Cheerleading Coach**. She brings great ideas and fun to aftercare. **Ms. Conte** our **African dance teacher** will take care of **first grade** on Wednesdays.
- Mr. Hall is returning as the second grade teacher, as is Mr. Thornton for third grade, Mr. Anderson for fourth grade and Ms. Hayes-Noel for fifth grade.

If you have any questions or concerns about specific matters that happen during class, please feel free to talk to your child's teacher first, and then let Ms. Riley the Program Director know if there is any further information or action required.

REMEMBER... PLEASE SIGN OUT every time you or another authorized person comes to pick up your child. Late pick up fees of \$1 a minute will apply this year.

Payment: PARENTS WILL BE CHARGED FOR LATE PAYMENT THIS YEAR

All payment is due on the first of the month and late after the 5th of the month. Late fees will apply October 6th, and on the 6th of each month thereafter you pay late. You will not receive a statement each month, please pay by credit card online, or by check or money order at school. We do not accept cash. No one will be allowed to carry over a balance month to month. In an urgent situation, you may receive written permission to pay late tuition without a late fee, however, your next tuition will still be due on time.

SCHOOL EVENTS:

When Shepherd has an event, like a PTA meeting, you must sign your child out of care and then sign your child into whatever child care is offered. If there is a field trip or sporting/extracurricular event where your child is supervised by a Shepherd teacher, that teacher may sign your child into care in the evening when they return and you will be expected to pick up your child as usual from aftercare by 6:30pm. After 6:30pm we are closed and do not accept students returning from sports games or other activities. Please be aware of the name of the teacher or coach and how to contact them so you know where and when your child can be picked up.

SCHOOL DANCES:

Star Achievers does not sell tickets, collect money or supervise school dances. We do NOT take any PS 3 or Pre K 4 students to school dances. If you would like your 3 or 4 year old to attend, please sign them out and take them to the dance. As an alternative to the dance, all Star Achievers' students will have pizza and a movie on dance days.


ELECTRONIC DEVICES:

Children are NOT allowed to have any phones, kindles or readers, computers or electronic devices of any kind in their possession during before or aftercare. If there is an urgent need for your student to call you, please have your student ask a staff member to use the school office phone or the Star Achievers phone. If you need to reach your student please call (202) 465-0514 or the school office.
