

### YOU MAY HAVE HEARD.... ABOUT LAST WEEK'S FIGHT



#### WHAT'S THE ISSUE?

• DC needs the House to pass a measure, which has already passed the Senate, to restore funds to DC that were restricted due to the CR that passed Congress last week.

#### WHAT'S AT STAKE?

- \$1.1 billion dollars removed from our current FY budget.
- Significant cuts to fire, police, schools, medical servies and other basic services across the city.

WHAT TO SAY TO THEM: (Note: As always, we have plans to escalate if needed, so please make this call with a positive tone)

[MOST IMPORTANT] I urge the House to swiftly take up a vote and pass the "District of Columbia Local Funds Act of 2025" as soon as possible. This threat hanging over our heads only causes chaos and worry for service providers, government agencies, and - most especially - community members who depend on a well functioning government. FY25 spending is already well underway, so any cuts would result in a haphazard and deep defunding of many critical government functions, such as education, trash collection, human services, fire fighters, and infrastructure. I am most worried about \_\_\_\_\_\_ [your story] if the cuts are not prevented.

Every single House office and committee has staffers who live in the DC community and others whose lives are closely intertwined with it. They - and all those who work in the federal government - will feel the catastrophic effects of the \$1.1 billion in cuts to DC's budget, if it is not fixed. Passage of this bill makes sense for so many reasons:

- The funds at issue are local dollars, and this massive cut will not save the federal government any money.
- DC has had 28 years of balanced budgets, including this one (which Congress had already approved) and clean audits.
- Thousands of DC residents have already visited or called in to lawmakers because we count on representatives of other states to do the right thing for our great District.

I appreciate the representative's understanding of the significant harm to our residents that not fixing this language causes. I look forward to the bipartisan support for this bill in the House.






